

Separation, Identity, Life and Death

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If all of reality is totally connected and unified as one – which is our current best understanding, there are no separate parts. Parts only seem to exist because we humans cannot discern the huge extent of the connections. Mostly we miss the connections made by the web of immaterial energy waves and fields.

Separation is an illusion created by the limitations of human perception. We humans perceive change at very limited scales, missing 99% of it. We think changes are separate and separable and caused by other separate variables, but they are not. Change is entirely systemic with ALL involved at every scale.

If there is no separation in a totally unified reality, there is no beginning or ending – just ongoing change. A cramp is change, a supernova is change, death is change. And no change at any scale is more significant than any other.

As difficult as it is for us modern humans – given our dominant material conception of reality where separation is a primary principle, Birth and Death are just transitions in ongoing change. We are a constantly evolving stitch in the ever changing fabric of reality, at once the stitch, the fabric and everything inbetween.
